

The Great Journey

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On July 17th 1975, when Billy was 38 years old, he got up early for an important and fascinating journey through space that he was about to embark upon with his friends Semjase and her people, the Plejaren.

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Billy stops his motorbike and after they greet each other warmly they are both lifted up through the air by a transportation beam into a waiting beamship that is hovering at 50 metres height.



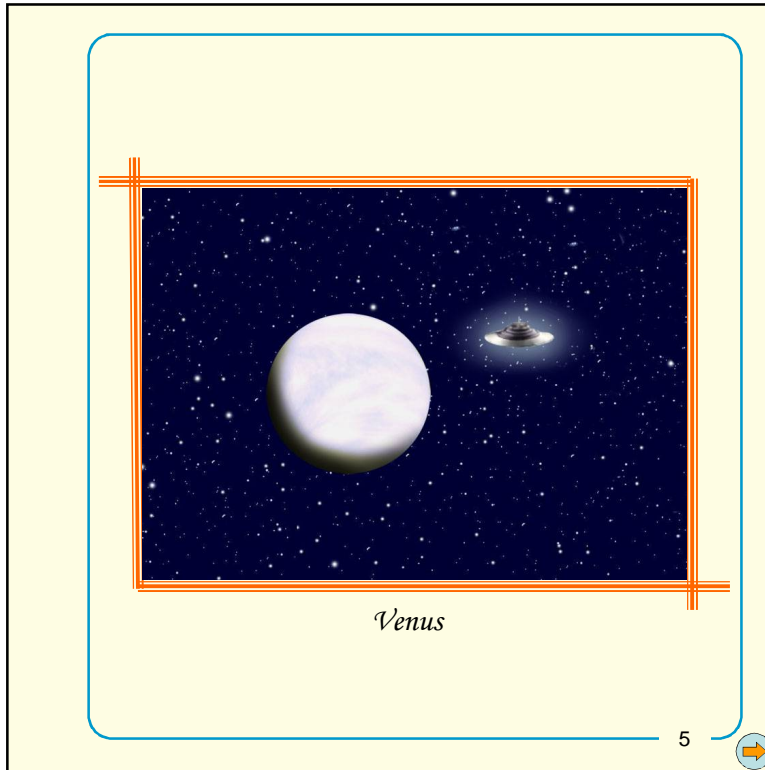

Neither harbour any human lifeforms because they are unsuitable for supporting due to the unsuitable atmosphere, but Semjase tells Billy that Venus is actually in an early stage of developing of primitive life.

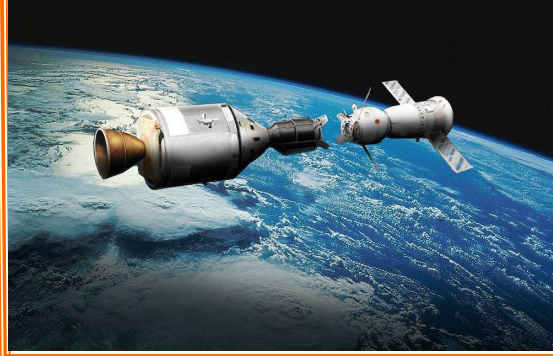
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They then fly back to the Earth and observe two small spacecraft dock with each other: an American Apollo space capsule and a Russian Soyuz capsule. Billy and Semjase use technology on the beamship to see through the hull of the space capsules to the inside. With this technology it now looks like the astronauts inside the space capsules are exposed to the airless space but of course they are not and so the astronauts continue with their mission, floating around inside the little ships. The beamship is cloaked and so it is invisible to the crew of the capsules.

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Semjase starts the beamship moving again, and already a few minutes later, looking through the viewport, the Earth shrinks to the size of a great star, which shines blue on the backdrop of space. This is a sky, full of life, Billy contemplates. Among the great and small stars are groups and clusters and the wide band of the Milky Way, immeasurable in size and beauty, amidst a thousand other things. All of it is simply fantastic. Billy is impressed by the immeasurable size and appearance of the Universe.

They arrive at a huge sphere, the Great Spacer, a huge spaceship housing 144,000 people that

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can travel to any point in space and time, even to another Universe. They fly in through one of its hangar bays where hundreds of other beamships are neatly lined up in rows to one side.

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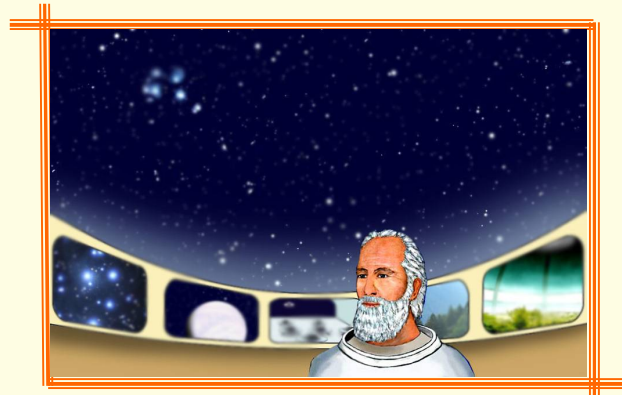
The huge hangar door slowly closes behind them. Semjase navigates the beamship up through an opening into a large vertical shaft and they soon arrive at the centre of the Great Spacer at an extremely large room full of green fields, flowers and trees of many species, a kind of a Garden of Eden.

They disembark the beamship after it has landed in a grassy clearing and Semjase takes him to an elevator nearby. She takes Billy to meet the captain of the Great Spacer, who is called Ptaah. He is also Semjase's father. They arrive in the command centre which is a large circular room with computer controls and visual



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displays all around the edge and in the centre is a slightly elevated, horseshoe-shaped control platform where Ptaah is standing. The ceiling of the command centre is a huge computer screen that is showing the stars in space. It is called a cupola.

They then make another hyperleap to the Orion Nebula which is about 1,800 light years from Earth. The next destination is the Crab Nebula which is about 3,150 light years from Earth. This nebula is the remains of a star that exploded about 1000 years ago. It went supernova. They then visit several more

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nebulas followed by a leap to the Andromeda galaxy, 2.2 million light years distant. It still only takes a split second to complete the hyperspace leap. Billy takes some more photos.

On the cupola Billy sees space become a glistening golden colour and then a bright silver gleaming colour. It fills the cupola and seems to become brighter than the light from all the stars in the Universe combined but his eyes do not hurt. At the same time he experiences the feeling of being within a timeless eternity. He feels full of love, peace and tranquility and longs to stay here, inside eternity, where there is no physical pain, no sorrow.

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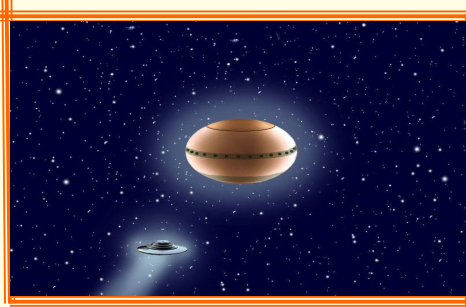

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Semjase gets Billy to jump down a chute next to the central control console and they both slide down like a torpedo into the hangar bay where they had been before. They take one of the beamships in the hangar bay out into free space and travel over to the other huge spaceship. They fly inside one of its empty hangars and disembark.

Orbiting the planets is a huge moon that Semjase explains is 5.24 times the size of planet Earth. Semjase and Billy use a beamship to visit the only human-inhabited one of the two monstrously big planets. Billy finds it all fantastic to observe.
